From our Pastor.....

It was a year ago that I was preparing to take two months of spiritual leave. Part of this spiritual leave included not being at the church during Advent and Christmas. I am still blessed by that time off and am still very grateful for the space that leave allowed.

Having the season of Advent without the demands of church life was such a gift to my spirit. I spent six days of Advent at St. Gertrude's Monastery in Cottonwood, ID and deeply felt a sense of peace during that time. When I got to Christmas Eve, I truly felt like I had experienced the rich space that Advent can offer.

As I face this coming season of Advent this year, I am pondering how to allow some of the space that I received last year even though I will be working during Advent. Many years I get to Christmas Eve and feel like I missed what the season of Advent is about. I do not want to do that again.

I realize, though, that I am not alone in hoping I get to Christmas Eve not just worn out. I suspect we all wonder at least to a degree about how we make the best of the season of Advent and how we experience the gift of the Christ child. So how do we all do this? How do we make the best use of the season of Advent so we can receive the gift of Christmas?

First, understand what the season of Advent is. In our culture, Christmas begins about mid-November and ends at midnight on Christmas Day. There is already Christmas music playing on one of the local radio stations and stores have been advertising Black Friday deals since Halloween.

But in the church, what society calls Christmas, we call Advent. The word Advent comes from the Latin word "*Adventus*" meaning coming. The season of Advent spans the four Sundays leading up to Christmas Eve and is the season that we wait for the coming of Christ—both the coming of Christ as a baby and the second coming of Christ. The days of Advent are designed for us to look within us and see what clutters our hearts and where we most need God's presence. It is a season of preparing and waiting for Christ to come.

So to experience Advent, is to see that these days leading up to Christmas are not in fact Christmas, but the time of preparing. Christmas is also not just one day that magically disappears at the stroke of midnight on December 25. Christmas is a season of 12 days (hence the song "The 12 Days of Christmas") and goes until Epiphany, the day we celebrate the coming of the wise men.

Second, before Advent truly gets underway, it is a good time to stop and think about what you need during this season of waiting and preparing for Christmas. Do you often feel like the season is much too busy and by the time you get to Christmas you are exhausted? Maybe this year, you need to look at your calendar and block off spaces each week when you have nothing scheduled.

In years past, have you gotten to Christmas and wondered what it is all about? Maybe this year, you need to find a devotion book to read during Advent and spend time reading scripture. Coming to worship during all the Sundays of Advent can also help you find the spiritual meaning of Christmas.

In years past, have you gotten to Christmas and felt like you spent too much money and yet have not pleased anyone on your gift list? Maybe this year, before you start buying presents, make yourself a budget and a list of what your family/friends would most enjoy for Christmas. Maybe it is not a present, but time with you. Then stick to that budget and list. Buying presents for others can be a great blessing during this season, but can become overwhelming.

Third, during each day of Advent, find time to just be. To breathe, to notice the wonder of the season around you, to spend quality time with your family/friends. Sit in front of your Christmas tree or your nativity set and be reminded of who Christ is and what Christ came to do for us.

Specific suggestions for experiencing the most of Advent

Devotional Material

- Upper Room Daily Devotional (available in the hallway of the church as well as on-line at upperroom.org)

- God Almighty, "We are Waiting" The Advent 2019 Scriptures and Reflection Booklet available at the church.
- If you go to Cokesbury.com under the tab Advent, they have a whole list of Advent devotional books you can order.
- For Children and families— The church has a copy of Advent A to Z: Prayerful and Playful Preparations for Families for you. See Lorrie in the nursery for your copy.
- The December issue of Pockets magazine for Children (available in the hallway of the church.)

Other options

- On Facebook go to *Rethink Church*. They usually have an Advent activity to do each day during Advent.
- Make cookies and/or other holiday treats and give out to your neighbors.
- Find little ways to help people during Advent. Put carts away in the parking lot, hold the door open for people, write thank you notes for people who help you, etc.
- Ask relatives or friends to share their memories of past Advents and Christmas celebrations.
- Put up a nativity set in a place in your house where you will see it every day. When you walk by it, thank God for the gift of Jesus.
- When you look at a clock to check the time, thank God for this time of waiting.
- Ponder the words to Advent and Christmas songs. Suggestions for Advent Songs "Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus" UMH #196, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" UMH #211, "Blessed be the God of Israel" UMH #209, "God Almighty We are Waiting" Worship and Song #3047. Christmas hymns—"Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" UMH #240, "Love Came Down at Christmas" UMH #242, "O Come, All Ye Faithful" UMH #234.

For me, I know that one of the gifts last Advent was to spend time reflecting on scripture through arts and crafts. So I have marked off a space for each week of Advent, to do just that.

May this season of Advent richly bless us as we wait for a savior to appear.

CALLING ALL KNITTERS, QUILTERS, FLEECE BLANKET MAKERS, CROCHETERS!

The Oregon-Idaho Conference of United Methodist Women is joining the Pacific Northwest and Alaska Conferences United Methodist Women in a project to make quilts for “Children at Risk.” The goal for our conference is 160, 40 from each district (but we are really hoping for 400!)

All the quilts will be taken to the combined Annual Conference on June 11-14, 2020 in Puyallup, WA. The quilts will then be divided among the districts for distribution to agencies benefiting/working with children.

The blankets can be **quilted, knitted, crocheted or made (tied) from fleece.**

Suggested dimensions for the finished quilts are:

**45" x 45" or 45" x 60"
or 56" x 84" for a twin bed**

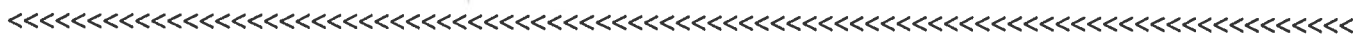

We have discussed the current needs of our congregation, the financial and physical challenges we are facing and have tossed around a few short and long-term goals. We have met with our Architect, Larry Abell, and went over the 20-year-old master plan and talked about its pros and cons in light of our current circumstances.

We have gotten some very preliminary feedback from the stewardship canvassing that has been happening, and will take that information into consideration as we move forward. In the discussion about these preliminary results, one bit of our conversation should be shared with everyone. That is that we each see our next step in this process in the light of how we as individuals use the church. Which is to say that those people who primarily just come to service on Sundays believe that we need a sanctuary; and those folks that attend classes, meetings and other get-togethers think that we need more meeting spaces. In light of this I would encourage everyone to broaden their use and understanding of how the current space is used. Try to squeeze in another Sunday in worship if you only attend meetings/classes. Try to find something that interests you and attend a class or meeting during the week. Involvement is the key to understanding where God needs us to move forward on this.

Advent Giving 2019

During the season of Advent, it is the tradition of Whitney UMC to collect an offering every Sunday in Advent for a different organization or ministry. Our Advent giving tradition helps us remember the true meaning of this season as we hear and prepare for the birth of Christ.

The Organizations and Ministries that we are supporting this year fit our church's mission to disciple and serve families and children.

December 1 --- The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is a ministry of The United Methodist Church dedicated to alleviating human suffering around the globe. UMCOR's work reaches people in more than 80 countries, including the United States. They provide humanitarian relief when war, conflict, or natural disaster disrupt life to such an extent that communities are unable to recover on their own. UMCOR provides survivors of these disasters not only temporary relief but long-term education, training, and support. UMCOR spends 100 percent of designated donations on the projects our donors specify. When UMCOR donors give their time, money, and supplies, they join UMCOR as the hands and feet of Christ.

December 8 – Whitney UMC's Good Samaritan Fund. This fund allows Rev. Christina to help those who come to the church with various needs. Because of your generosity last year, we were able to help many families put gas in their cars so that they could look for work. We helped two families get enough gas to travel out of state for new jobs. We helped a couple of homeless families with a hotel room for a night. We were able to provide hope and God's grace through this fund. Often the things that people need are not things that they can find at other agencies.

December 15 --- Whitney's United Methodist Women and United Methodist Men groups
Whitney's United Methodist Women and United Methodist Men's group both support ministries in the church as well as ministries in our community and around the world. Both groups rely mostly on donations from their members to support their work. This offering will help the UMW provide scholarships for Whitney graduating seniors and help them as they support Whitney Elementary and the other ministries they are a part of. The offering for UMM will help them support their ministries like providing camp scholarships, helping with Thanksgiving and Christmas boxes and other needs in the church and community.

December 22— Big Brothers, Big Sisters

Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) helps children realize their potential and build their futures by providing a 1:1 relationship with an Adult Mentor (known as a Big) with a child (known as a little) who would benefit from the mentoring of an adult. Rev. Christina recently had been a Big and experienced the blessing this program provides to both the Big and the Little. Your contribution to this program will help in matching a Big with a Little.

December 24—Whitney Elementary

Whitney Elementary is the school right across the street from Whitney UMC. Whitney Elementary is a Community School which connects students and families with community partners to provide them what they need to succeed in school. Whitney UMC is one of those community partners. Donations to Whitney Elementary helps provide resources to help these families.


